

A colorful cast of characters including the likes of the Giant family, the Harp and her Harpettes, and the Golden Goose to name a few, join us on our journey. A variety of boy and girl characters helps to bring this story to life. Camp participants will learn about auditioning and then audition for our musical (everyone is cast.) Next, participants will hone their acting, singing, and dancing skills and have a lot of fun rehearsing the production. Participants will also have the opportunity to assist with creating costumes, props, and set pieces. Finally, we will perform our production of Hit the Road, Jack: The Story of a Boy and a Beanstalk on Saturday for family and friends.

## Summer Stars: The Sherwood Forest -Stage Combat Camp

Long ago, in England's Sherwood Forest lived Robin Hood and his Merry Men and Women who steal from the rich and give to the poor, breaking the laws imposed by the Sheriff of Nottingham and his followers. Have you ever wondered how characters in plays fight without getting hurt? Stage combat instruction teaches skills of collaboration, control, partnering, presentation, and evaluation. From prat falls to faces slammed in doors, a simple push to an intricate sword fight, students will learn safe techniques of physical comedy and drama along with character acting and storytelling. By the end of the week students will create an epic forest attack and perform it on stage. Students will receive a t-shirt and a permanent English accent. Ho! Ha ha! Guard! Turn! Parry! Dodge! Spin! Ha! Thrust!

# SUMMER CAMP CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

## 6-9 Year Olds

#### Once Upon a Time

9-10:15 am

This class is designed to ignite the playwrights and actors in us all. You'll learn how to create a believable character, basic theater terminology and how to build a scene. Students will create their own characters and then rehearse an original skit complete with dialogue, costumes, and props to perform for family and friends.

#### Masks, Mime and Music

10:30-11:45 am

Explore acting without the use of students' voices. Combining the art of mask-making, pantomime, and creative movement to music, students will showcase their ability to play a character in a story without using their voices. Join us for a class that mixes art and theater in imaginative ways.

#### Musical Theater

12:30-1:45 pm

This class introduces vocal technique, movement, and acting skills through some of Broadway's popular shows. Working on musical theater pieces will build the confidence and abilities of young performers, and students will combine their singing, dancing, and acting skills to present a Broadway performance for family and friends on the day of the showcase. Explore the magic of the Great White Way!

#### Creative Drama

2-3:15 pm

Children's books, poetry and folk tales will serve as the basis of this energetic acting class. Each exciting class will build confidence as students learn acting basics. Through the use of creativity, improvisation, dialogue and movement exercises, young actors will learn how to bring the written page to life on stage.

## 9-11 Year Olds

#### Musical Theater

9-10:15 am

This class introduces vocal technique, movement, and acting skills through some of Broadway's popular shows. Working on musical theater pieces will build the confidence and abilities of young performers, and students will combine their singing, dancing, and acting skills to present a Broadway performance for family and friends on the day of the showcase. Explore the magic of the Great White Way!

#### Action! Act!

10:30-11:45 am

Students will develop ideas for their own commercials, creating their own original product to sell. Using only the kids' ideas, the instructor will put their work into a commercial script. Students will then perform their commercials live.

#### Make a Scene

12:30-1:45 pm

This fun format introduces students to warm-ups, stage direction, theater etiquette, character analysis, scene work and more while learning ensemble building skills and gaining self confidence. Discover how to use your body and voice to create a convincing character, improve your ability to communicate emotions on stage and work together to tell a story. Students will work as an ensemble to perform a scene from a play.

#### Incredible Improv

2-3:15 pm

Improv means creating unscripted stories, scenes and characters in the moment and on the spot. It's fun, challenging and a great way to practice teamwork on the stage (and off). In this class you will learn the "rules" of improv, and you will practice the skills that make an improvised scene really click. This class is designed to build confidence and foster creative thinking through the art of improvisation. Students will highlight their favorite improvisation games for our final showcase.

## 12-15 Year Olds

#### Comedy Camp

9-10:15 am

Work out your comic timing and lose yourself laughing! This course will focus on both performance and writing skills of sketch comedy. Students will use theater games, improvisation, and a variety of writing exercises to explore their role as comedic actor and writer. Students will work with each other and the instructors to write and create original sketch comedies. Each comedian will showcase their work at a staged reading on the *final Friday of camp* and will perform one of class's original skits during our final performance.

#### Make a Scene

10:30-11:45 am

This fun format introduces students to warm-ups, stage direction, theater etiquette, character analysis, scene work and more while learning ensemble building skills and gaining self-confidence. Discover how to use your body and voice to create a convincing character, improve your ability to communicate emotions on stage and work together to tell a story. Students will work as an ensemble to perform a scene from a play.
