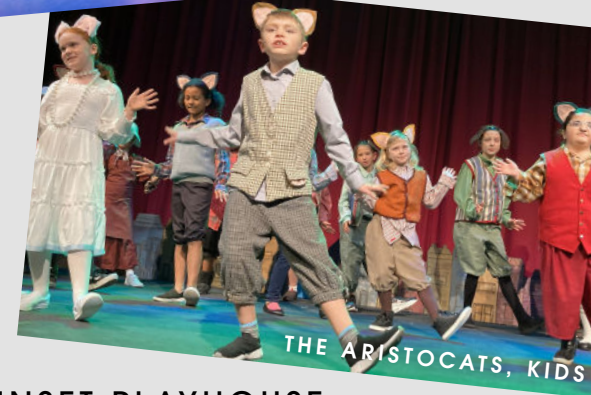

Dear Sunset Stars:

The arts teach students innumerable lessons—practice makes progress, small differences can have large effects, collaboration leads to creativity. The arts also teach children that there are several paths to take when approaching problems and that all problems can have more than one solution. And let's face it—the arts inspire children to use their imaginations, to play, and to have fun!

The mission of Sunset Playhouse includes an emphasis on education. Our renowned School for the Arts has been educating and entertaining children for more than fifty years. We nurture self-confidence, encourage collaboration, and value each student who participates in our programs as a unique individual.

Our 2022-23 school offerings welcomed students to the theater to learn and create. Fall and Winter Weekly Session programming brought out over 117 students in 13 classes. Our robust summer camp programming provided 32 options with more than 426 students participating. Our waitlists grew this year. While it makes us sad that we couldn't provide an opportunity for every interested student, it points to continued growth and excitement for theater education.

This season we produced three JR musicals, a high school play and two KIDS musical productions. Our Spring Junior Musical, DESCENDANTS, garnered enough students to have two full casts with six performances. These offerings resulted in full performance opportunities for more than 150 students and numerous patrons of all ages. Thanks to grant funding, we were able to offer a student audience performance of our JR Musicals free of charge to area elementary and middle school students.

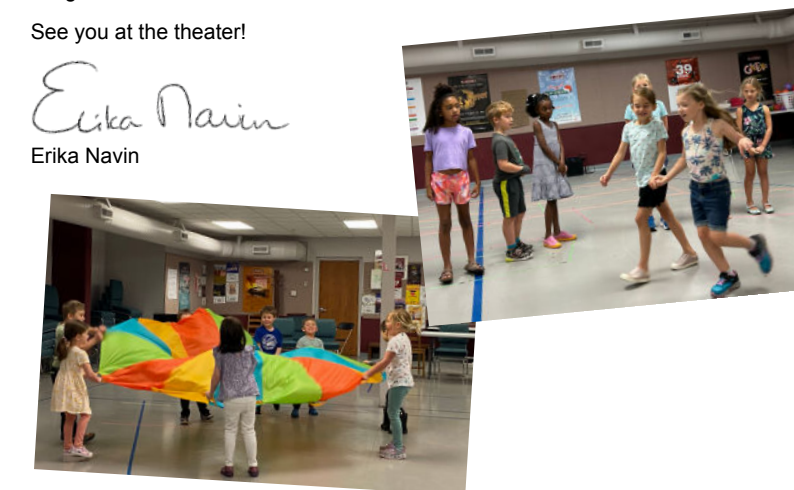
Our bug in a rug Children's Theater performed at Sunset Playhouse for the public and also toured to local libraries and elementary schools. Two original musicals brought 700 patrons through our doors. And our bug in a rug series entertained 7,500+ children in over 50 traveling performances. This season we also brought the Fairy Godmother to Sunset for a special day of tea, cookies, singing, and interactive storytelling. The Sundays at Sunset BROADWAY'S BEST CABARET showcased 15 local high school students singing their favorite show tunes.

In this year of growth, I am proud to report all these fantastic numbers for our School for the Arts. But more importantly, we are proud of the experiences Sunset is able to provide for students. I, the teaching staff, and professional performers work hard to inspire a new generation of theater patrons, volunteers, and participants. In a time when technology has become a huge part of our lives, I am proud that Sunset continues to provide vibrant opportunities for students to connect in person, use their imaginations, take risks, and build confidence.

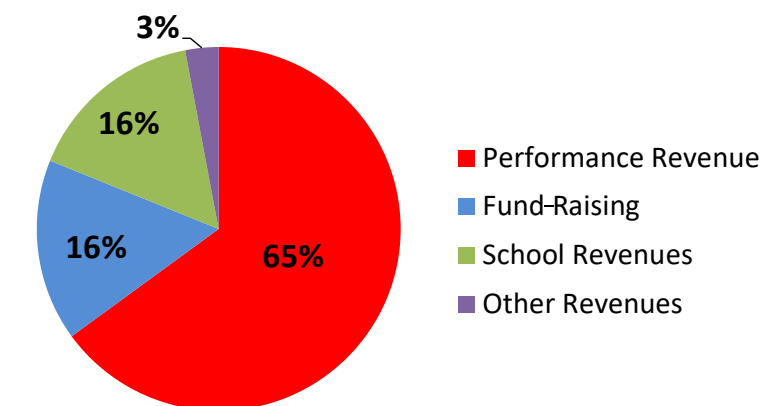

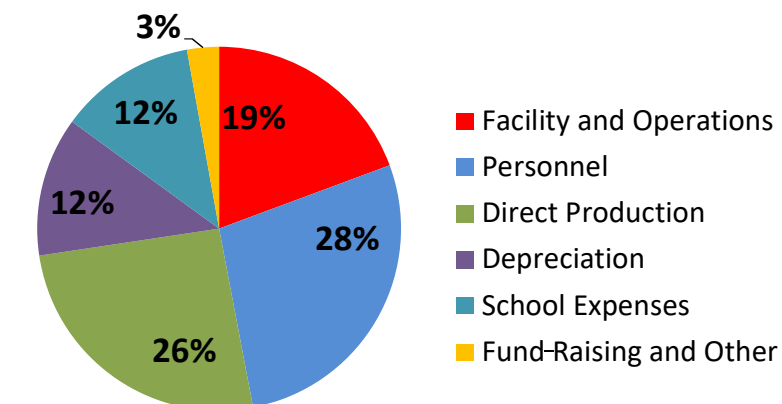

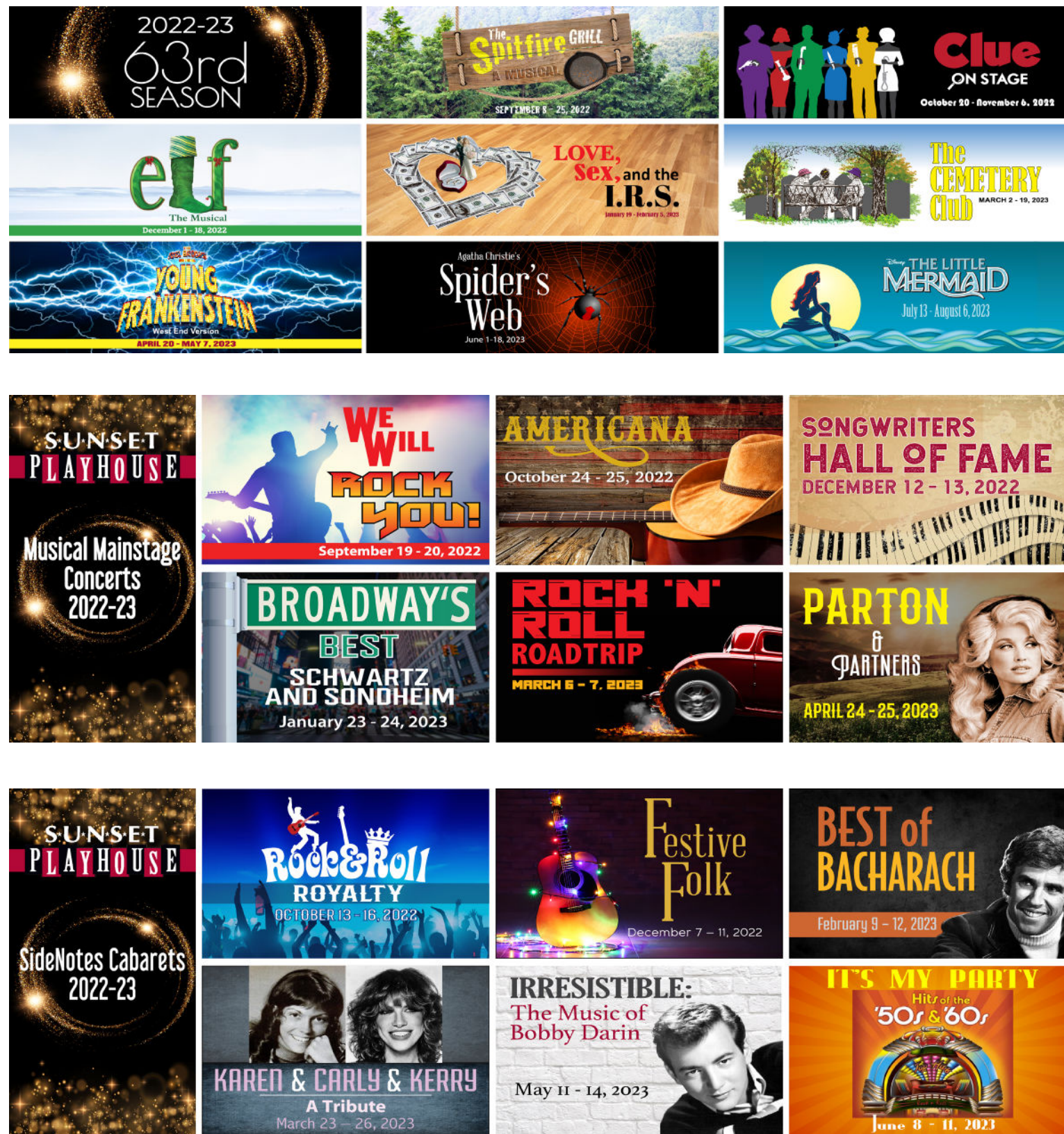
