What a wonderful season we had! Attendance increased to pre-Covid levels so I think people have decided that the convenience of Sunset, as well as the quality of the performances they see here, has made our charming venue a desirable destination!

We had two sold-out musicals this season--Jesus Christ Superstar and A Chorus Line. JCS was sold out before it opened and I do believe that is a first! Season ticket sales have increased and people are buying individual tickets way in advance so they don't miss their favorites! The Musical MainStage and SideNotes series continue to be very popular and also sell out quickly.

We are grateful for the support you continue to demonstrate by attending performances, contributing time and money, and spreading the word about Sunset!

We are very proud to have established an endowment to secure the future of Sunset Playhouse! We have also approved matching endowment donations up to \$300,000 dollars.

We established a small planning committee to focus on the next three to five years, and the board did a risk assessment to determine our most pressing issues. We continue to work through and develop a plan to address the most important concerns.

Of course, maintaining the building and upgrading our facility is an important priority. We also prioritize upgrades to light and sound equipment so that our productions are high quality. We continue to attract talented performers, directors, technical people, and appreciative patrons, and we intend to maintain that level of quality and provide entertainment for all ages!

Our school for the Arts continues to grow. We are staging a number of junior musicals which are very popular. The school and its outreach programs are an important priority and a major part of our Mission.

We celebrated Denver, Diamond, Dylan, Lennon, McCartney, and many other artists with Musical MainStage Concerts and enjoyed tributes to Julie Andrews, Dean Martin, Johnny Cash, Patsy Kline, and more during the SideNotes Cabarets.

At Sunset Playhouse, the 2023-24 season meant non-stop productions and the offerings were varied, exciting, and often sold out! The Furlan Auditorium hosted our mainstage musicals and plays, Musical MainStage Concerts, and School for the Arts Junior musicals, while our Marla Eichmann Studio Theater offered SideNotes Cabarets, After Sunset dramas, bug in a rug and School for the Arts performances, and many special events. In total, our patrons enjoyed four musicals, including JESUS CHRIST SUPERSTAR which sold out BEFORE it opened, three comedies, one mystery, two dramas, three junior musicals, half a dozen Musical MainStage Concerts, six SideNotes Cabarets, two bug in a rug children's shows, six junior and KIDS' musicals and plays, as well as several exciting, unique special events. No other theater in the Midwest can claim so many productions in one season!

In addition, Sunset continues to actively seek and welcome new volunteers and members. We simply couldn't do all we do without them and we hope you will continue to be part of the Playhouse and also encourage your friends and family to join the Sunset family.

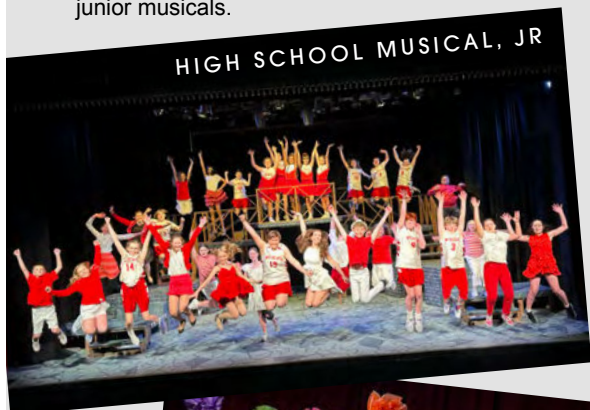

The School for the Arts offers weekly classes for all children ages 2-18, specialty workshops, performing arts camps, and two fully-staged junior musicals.

Dear Sunset Stars:

The arts teach students innumerable lessons—practice makes progress, small differences can have large effects, collaboration leads to creativity. The arts also teach children that there are several paths to take when approaching problems and that all problems can have more than one solution. And let's face it - the arts inspire children to use their imaginations, to play and have fun!

The mission of Sunset Playhouse includes an emphasis on education. Our renowned School for the Arts has been educating and entertaining children for more than fifty years. We nurture self-confidence, encourage collaboration, and value each student who participates in our programs as a unique individual.

Our 2023-24 school offerings brought many students to the theater to learn and create. Fall and Winter weekly session programming welcomed 149 students in 16 classes (a 25% increase from last season). Our robust summer camp programming provided 33 options with 435 students participating (a 5% increase from last season – but reaching close to maximum capacity). Our waitlists continued to grow this year—disappointing because we can't provide an opportunity for every interested student but exciting since they point to the continued appeal of theater education.

This season we produced three JR Musical productions, a High School Play, and two KIDS Musical productions. Our spring offering, Willy Wonka KIDS, attracted enough students to have two full casts with eight performances. These offerings resulted in full performance opportunities for more than 176 students and numerous patrons of all ages. Thanks to grant funding, we were able to offer a student audience performance of our JR Musicals free of charge to area elementary and middle school students.

Our bug in a rug Children's Theater performed for the public at Sunset Playhouse and toured to local libraries and elementary schools. Our bug in a rug shows entertained more than 9,000 children over 61 traveling performances. This season we also brought the Fairy Godmother to Sunset for a special day of tea, cookies, singing, and interactive story telling. The Sundays at Sunset Broadway's Best Cabaret showcased 13 local high school students singing their favorite show tunes

In this year of growth, I am proud to report all these fantastic numbers for our School for the Arts. But more importantly, we are proud of the experiences the Playhouse is able to provide for students. I, the teaching staff, and professional performers work hard to inspire a new generation of theater patrons, volunteers, and participants. I am proud that Sunset provides vibrant opportunities for students to connect in person, use their imagination, take risks, and build confidence.

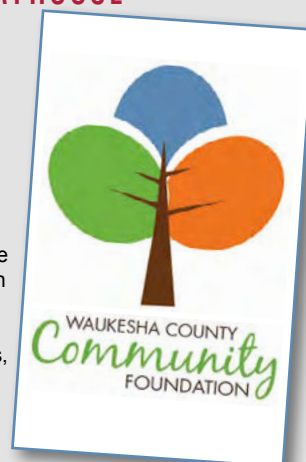
SPONSOR A SUNSET SHOW

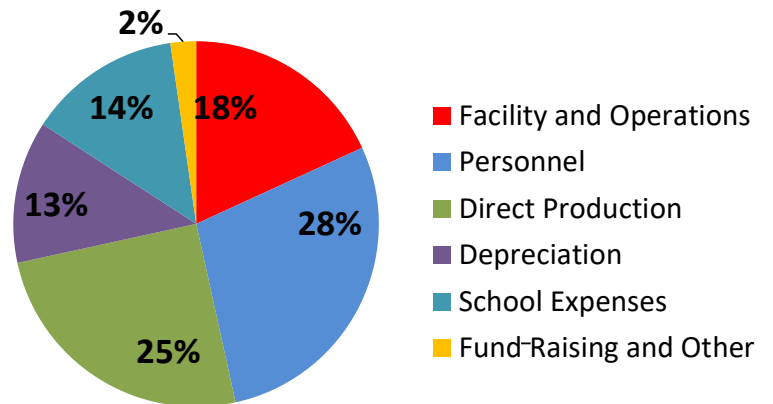
